From the Pastor: Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers. **Galatians 6:9-10**

In the United States, on July Fourth, Americans celebrate Independence Day. One of the things that people need to be reminded of is that freedom isn't free. In this world, someone always pays the price for people to be truly free. In reading for this devotion, I went back to the very signers of the Declaration of Independence, all 56 of them. Did you know how much they risked for your freedom?

If they won the war with the British, there would still be years of hardship as a struggling nation. If they lost, they would face a hangman's noose. And yet there it is where it says, "We herewith pledge, our lives, our fortunes, and our sacred honor." They signed it, but did you know what price they paid for those signatures

Of the 56 signers of the Declaration, few were long to survive. Five were captured by the British and tortured before they died. Twelve had their homes -- from Rhode Island to Charleston -- sacked and looted, occupied by the enemy, or burned. Two of them lost their sons in the Army; one had two sons captured. Nine of the 56 died in the War from its hardships or merciful bullets. They had learned that liberty is so much more important than security, for that they pledged their lives, their fortunes, and their sacred honor. They fulfilled their pledge; they paid the price, and freedom was born.

It's hard to imagine paying such a price so that others might be free. But then, we're reminded of the price Jesus Christ paid for our freedom, not just politically for the moment, but eternally for all time. In order to save us from our sins, God literally had come into our predicament, as the God-Man, to live our life perfectly, to pay the debt for our sin personally, and to give us the eternal life He earned as a gift, received by grace alone, through faith. When it comes to freedom, I pray that you yearn for the freedom that comes in Christ alone more than any of the other freedoms combined. You'll be blessed if you do!

(from Latin for *holy*) isn't the full worship space but the area right before the altar. The location of the lectern, from which Scripture is read, and pulpit, used for preaching, may vary.



QUESTION: Many people have read the Left Behind series of books by Tim LaHaye and Jerry Jenkins. While these are fiction books, they discuss the "end times" within a biblical context. What is the LCMS position on these books and their portrayal of the end times?

ANSWER: The conceptual framework for the *Left Behind* series is the so-called "rapture," which is a central aspect of dispensational pre-millennial views of the end times.

Such views conflict with the Lutheran position on what the Scriptures and the Lutheran confessional writings teach concerning the coming of Christ and the end of the world.

To assist readers in their evaluation of the Left Behind series, we recommend they consult the 1989 report of the Commission on Theology and Church Relations titled, <u>The End Times: A Study of Eschatology and Millennialism</u>. Included in this report is a discussion of current views of "the rapture" and helpful charts summarizing them.

You also may wish to read an article that appeared in the March 2001 issue of *The Lutheran Witness* titled, "Will You Be Left Behind?"



ST. PETER'S LUTHERAN CHURCH SPECIAL VOTERS MEETING June 23, 2024 To be approved at the July 21, 2024 meeting

President Dave Scantlin called the special meeting of St. Peter's Lutheran Church voters to order at 10:53 a.m. on Sunday, June 23, 2024.

Pastor Matt Jennings opened the meeting with a prayer.

The roll call was answered by 29 members.

President Dave Scantlin stated that the purpose of the special voters meeting was to select an insurance company to cover the church.

Steve Bulk presented a chart that compares the current insurance coverage to the 2 quotes that have been received. The companies that have sent quotes for consideration are the Loomis Insurance that was sent by agent Jerry Alexander and PSI Insurance sent by agent Loren Korte. A third quote was received from Schenk Insurance presented by agent Mary Love however that quote is incomplete so it was not considered.

The current insurance coverage that the church has the from the Church Mutual company but that company will drop the church insurance as of June 30, 2024.

The quote from the Loomis Company is for \$15,991.00 per year and the PSI Company is for \$36,980.58. Loomis will cover the church for everything except wind and hail damage. PSI will cover everything including wind and hail damage.

The committee recommended to accept the Loomis Company and to take \$50,000 from the property improvement fund and place it into an account to save in case the church or parsonage have would have wind and/or hail damage.

John Lassman made the motion to accept the Loomis Company quote. Darrell Krone seconded the motion. The motion passed.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
