
As a result of Our Father's love for us, we too love one another. We love one another as baptized children of God. What does that look like? We send flowers and cards to people in our church who

CENSER & INCENSE

A censer (or thurible) is a vessel for burning incense during worship. Eastern Orthodox and Roman Catholic churches, as well as some Protestant ones, often do this on special occasions. Censers come in many sizes, shapes and designs. A worship leader may swing a chain censer to waft the fragrant smoke over the congregation during a procession or benediction. As incense burns in a censer and smoke wafts

upward, it symbolizes prayers of the faithful, floating to God. "May my prayer be set before you like incense; may the lifting up of my hands be like the evening sacrifice" (Psalm 141:2, NIV).



QUESTION: Can you sin in heaven? My first thought is that one cannot. But then I wonder if God takes away our free will when we get to heaven? I can't imagine why we would want to sin in heaven — we'll be perfect and the place we are will be perfect. But then I think of Adam and Eve before the fall — they were perfect, made in God's image, and they lived in a perfect place. Yet they had free will and sinned.

ANSWER: Your first thought, from your knowledge of the Bible, is correct beyond all doubt. There is no sin in heaven, because it is the place where the sinless God dwells.

Those who have been cleansed in the blood of the Lamb have been cleansed forever. There is no more death in heaven, the result of sin. We die once and then the judgment. Our death ends sin, the Scripture says.

Just as the good angels are fixed in their sinless state now, so also we shall be. We will serve God forever willingly, but it will be impossible for us to will to sin as did our first parents.

In heaven it will not be like in the beginning of our human history. Old things have passed away, the new has come (Rev. 21:4). There will be only life, eternal life, and where there is eternal life there is eternal sinlessness.

Rest your soul on that and praise God for His great goodness in giving us a sinless Savior.



ST. PETER'S LUTHERAN CHURCH VOTERS MEETING January 12, 2025

To be approved at the April 13, 2025 meeting

President Joseph Jennings called the meeting of St. Peter's Lutheran Church voters to order at 11:00 a.m. on Sunday, January 12, 2025.

Darrell Krone opened the meeting with a prayer.

The roll call was answered by 39 members.

Lynn Lytle made a motion to accept the consent agenda as printed. Joan Perez seconded the motion after the correction was made on the agenda from the date of the Voters Meeting minutes from October 13, 2023 to October 13, 2024. Motion carried.

Old Business:

The Council had discussed the question of having the voters meeting on April 13, 2025, which is Palm Sunday. The Council decided to keep the date as it is.

New Business:

President Joseph Jennings announced the appointment of Lynn Lytle for the position of Vice President. (Joseph Jennings stepped up to the President's position after the resignation of Dave Scantlin effective December 10, 2024.)

Alan Hauser discussed the distribution of the Endowment Fund Income for 2025. He suggested that the Endowment Fund be divided with 50% going to the Property Improvement Fund and 25% to the Woods mission ministry and 25% to the Heiney mission ministry. Scott Baker made the motion for 50% of the Endowment Fund going to the Property Improvement Fund, 25% to the Woods mission ministry and 25% to the Heiney mission ministry. Darrell Krone seconded the motion.

Motion carried

President Joseph Jennings announced the appointment of Troy Lott to the Stewardship Committee for a 3-year term.

Steve Bulk presented a list of projects that the Trustees are considering but would like to have input from the voters as to what the voters sees as an order of importance to work on. Those projects include new flooring in the fellowship hall, storage building, awnings in the fellowship hall and kitchen door, blinds in the Sanctuary, blinds in the fellowship hall, replacement of windows with double pane windows in the fellowship hall, Sunday School rooms and Sanctuary, paint for the inside of the church, paint on the outside of the church and new counter tops in the kitchen and scarcity. The Trustees passed out ballots for each of the voters to select 4 projects in order of priority with 1 being the highest priority. The Trustees will meet in the next week to see what the voters deem as most important.

A question came up about the storage building and what it will be used for. Also, there was discussion held about renting a storage shed.

Steve Bulk also announced that the Trustees are getting a quote for a new sound system. The system will be paid out of the Property Improvement Fund with a donor reimbursing the final cost to the fund. Alan Hauser made the motion to go ahead with the sound system project. Lynn Lytle seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Joan Perez thanked the Trustees for all of the work that they do.

A suggestion was made to contact families of those that have memorial funds in their relatives' names that has not been allocated to a special project to see if those funds can be used to help pay for some of the projects of the church.

Announcements:

Scott Baker announced that the Annual Ground Hog Feed will be held on February 1st and that volunteers are needed to help.

The meeting adjourned at 11:22 a.m. by standing and saying The Lord's Prayer.
